22	Lemon Honey Cake, made according to this recipe: 170g butter, 60g caster sugar, 140g honey, 3 large eggs, 225g self raising flour, grated rind of a lemon and juice of half a lemon. Cream together the butter, sugar and honey. Mix in lemon rind. Beat eggs lightly and add to the mixture. Stir in lemon juice and fold in sieved flour. Transfer to a greased and base lined 900g (2lb) loaf tin and bake for 1hr - 1hr 10mins at 160°C/ (140°C fan)/325°F/Gas mark 3. (Timing is for conventional ovens and is a guide as appliances vary).	£8	£4	£2
23	Honey Sultana and Cherry Cake, made according to this recipe: 200g self raising flour, 175g honey, 110g butter, 2 medium eggs, 175g sultanas, 110g glace cherries. Wash the sultanas and cherries to remove any syrup and dry them. Halve the cherries, cream the butter with honey until light and fluffy. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs together and gradually add the beaten eggs to the butter mixture a little at a time, beating between each addition. Sieve the flour and mix the fruit with it to ensure the fruit is dry. Gradually fold in the flour and fruit. Add a little milk if necessary, to achieve a dropping consistency. Put the mixture into an 18cm (7inch) lined round cake tin. Bake at 160°C/ (140°C fan)/325°F/Gas mark 3 for approximately 1hr 30mins until the cake is firm. (Timing is for conventional ovens and is a guide as appliances vary).	£8	£4	£2
24	Honey Snickerdoodle Biscuits, made according to this recipe: 198g self-raising flour, 142g butter, 85g caster sugar, 2 large tablespoons honey, 1 egg yolk. Plus 43g caster sugar for rolling the dough balls in. Cream sugar, butter, honey and egg yolk and sift in the flour mixing well. Form the dough into walnut size balls, roll in the caster sugar and place on a baking tray covered with silicone or greaseproof paper. Flatten with a fork and cook in a medium oven, 180°C/ (160°C fan)/ 350°F/ Gas mark 4 for 15-20 minutes or until golden brown. The recipe makes 20 biscuits, please enter your best 7. HONEY SHOW RULES

1. Entry forms, accompanied by entrance fees made payable to The Gower Agricultural Society, must be returned to the Honey Show Secretary **NO LATER THAN 8pm ON Thursday 1st August 2024. No refunds will be made.**
2. It is expected that the tent should be ready to accept entries for staging by approx 12 Noon on Saturday 3rd August 2024. All exhibits are to be staged by 1.30pm. Judging to commence at 2.00pm.
3. Every entry must bear a numbered label supplied by the Show Secretary. On every shallow comb, label to be attached at top right hand corner of the display case. On every container of cut comb, label to be attached on the lid. On every jar of honey, honey preserve or honey chutney, and every bottle of mead, metheglin or melomel, number must be affixed about 12 mm from the bottom of the bottle or jar. Cakes of wax must have the label fixed on the underside and also on the plate. In classes, 16, 17, 22, 23 and 24 the label should be fixed to the disposable plate supplied by the Chief Steward.
4. Extracted honey must be exhibited in 454g squat unlabeled jars, with gold screw top lids. In the commercial class (Class 10) any type of jar and lid can be used as long as the minimum total weight of honey is 3lb, the exhibitor's own label will account for 10% of the total marks. Chutneys and preserves must be exhibited in a 340g hexagonal jar with a gold twist top lid. Light, medium and dark honey will be defined using B D grading glasses as used at the National Honey Show.
5. Meads, metheglin and melomel to be shown in clear glass bottles, 75cl approx, with white flanged stoppers which can be obtained from the Chief Steward if required.
6. Metheglin, melomel, preserve and chutney labels are to be plain white and are supplied by the Show Secretary, no other labels will be allowed. The labels are to be written in block capital letters and the preserve and chutney labels are to mention honey.
7. Exhibitors may enter more than one exhibit in a class, but no single exhibit may be shown in more than one class and an exhibitor shall not be entitled to more than one award in any class.
8. The judge reserves the right to withhold prizes in case of insufficient merit. The decision of the judge is final.
9. Exhibitors and Stewards may bring honey and hive products for sale on a sale or return basis (max. 22.5 kg), an approved commission being charged. Honey to be sold only by stewards appointed by the committee. Any deemed to be sub-standard will be rejected. The honey offered for sale must conform to existing regulations including being registered as a food business.
HONEY PRESENTED FOR SALE MUST BE FITTED WITH TAMPER EVIDENT SEALS.
10. All objections to be made in writing to the Show Secretary before 2.00pm on the day of the show, with a deposit of £10 which will be forfeited if the Committee declares the objection frivolous.
11. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage done before, during or after the Show.
12. No exhibit may be removed before 5.30pm except with the permission of the Show Secretary. Any person found interfering with the exhibits will be liable to expulsion and the forfeiture of any prizes won.
13. No person shall be allowed in the Marquee during the time of judging, except those officially engaged.
14. The Judge's Steward is not allowed to exhibit.
15. Entries must be produced by the exhibitors, except wax used in classes 3 and 29, seed honey used in class 8 and also honey used in baking, preserves, chutneys, meads, craft etc. These need not be the produce of exhibitors.
16. The Novice Classes are open to exhibitors who have not previously won a prize for honey/wax/candles (as relevant) at any honey show.
17. The craft in class 29 is to be one not covered in other classes.
18. Prize money to be paid on Show day.
19. The Dorothea Daniel-Jenkins Challenge Cup and The Joe's Novice Cup are to be held for one year only.
20. Payment for honey and hive products sold under Rule 9 will be made within 30 days of the Show.

THIRD PARTY LIABILITY

The Society, its Officers or Servants, shall not be responsible to any person whatsoever while on the Society's premises or while entering or leaving same, for any damage or loss however caused, to the property of any such person or for any injury fatal or otherwise to any such person.

The Society, its Officers or Servants shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss, however caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant, or to any animal, article or property, brought into the Showground, or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the said Showground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought on to the Showground by him, and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.

The Society has a responsibility to maintain the Park's high standard. Therefore entrants bringing their entries on Saturday and early Sunday morning may have to park their vehicles a little further from the marquee, there will be help available from volunteers for multiple entries.
