CONDITIONS

- a. Two entries only allowed in each class by the same competitor or competitors from the same garden.
- b. All exhibits must be grown by the competitor upon land in his own occupation and in any case where the Committee finds that borrowing has been done, the competitor will be disqualified and if the Committee finds that the exhibitor has purchased or received his exhibits from any source other than his own garden, he will be disqualified for a period of 3 years.
- c. The committee reserves the right to inspect all produce entered prior to the Show, and if it finds any exhibit on the Show Bench and is satisfied the same was not produced from the competitor's garden, it will be ticketed 'Disqualified from Competition'. The decision of the Committee is final upon all points of objection.
- d. All exhibits must be staged not later than 3.30 p.m. on the day prior to the Show (Saturday 2nd August) and shall remain on the Show Bench until 5.00 p.m. on the Show day (Sunday 3rd August)
- e. The General Conditions of the Society shall apply.

Third Party Liability

The Society, its Officers or Servants, Shall not be responsible to any person whatsoever while on the Society's premises or while entering or leaving same, for any damage or loss however caused, to the property of any such person or for any injury fatal or otherwise to any such person. The Society, its Officers or Servants shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss, however caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant, article or property, brought into the showground, or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the showground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought on to the showground by him, and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be caused or occasioned.

Vehicle parking

The Society has a responsibility to maintain the Park's high standard. Therefore, exhibitors bringing their entries on Saturday and early Sunday morning may have to park their vehicles a little further from the marguee. There will be help available from volunteers for multiple entries.

Data Protection

Contact details will be retained by the Horticultural Secretary for 3 years and will be used solely for the purposes of contacting competitors, judges, stewards and sponsors. Personal information will not be shared with third parties without the owner's consent.
